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disposal.

4. FIRST AID MEASURES:

General information : Get medical advice/attention if you feel unwell. Show this safety data sheet to the doctor in attendance.

Ingestion : Call a physician or poison control center immediately. Rinse mouth. Do not induce vomiting. If vomiting occurs, keep head low so that stomach content doesn't get into the lungs. 5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES:

Suitable (and unsuitable) extinguishing media

Suitable extinguishing media : Water Foam Carbon dioxide (CO2) Dry powder.

Unsuitable extinguishing media : For this substance/mixture no limitations of extinguishing agents are given.

Specific hazards arising from the chemical : Vapors may cause a flash fire or ignite explosively. Vapors may travel considerable distance to a source of ignition and flash back. Prevent buildup of vapors or gases to explosive concentrations. Vapor from the solvent may accumulate in container headspace resulting in flammability hazard. Heat may cause the containers to explode.

Special protective equipment and precautions for firefighters

Special firefighting procedures : Carbon oxides Sulphur oxides Hydrogen chloride gas Combustible. Development of hazardous combustion gases or vapours possible in the event of fire.

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES:

Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures : Advice for non-emergency personnel: Avoid inhalation of dusts. Avoid substance contact. Ensure adequate ventilation. Evacuate the danger area, observe emergency procedures, consult an expert.

Methods and material for containment and cleaning up : Eliminate all ignition sources if safe to do so. Use only non-sparking tools. Take precautionary measures against static discharges. Stop leak if possible without any risk. Absorb spill with vermiculite or other inert material, then place in a container for chemical waste. Clean surface thoroughly to remove residual contamination. Dike far ahead of larger spill for later recovery and disposal.

Notification Procedures : Prevent entry into waterways, sewer, basements or confined areas. Inform authorities if large amounts are involved.

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE:

Precautions for safe handling : Do not handle until all safety precautions have been read and understood. Do not handle, store or open near an open flame, sources of heat or sources of ignition. Protect material from direct sunlight. Take precautionary measures against static discharges. Ground/bond container and receiving equipment. Use explosion-proof electrical/ventilating/lighting/equipment. Use only non-sparking tools. Wear protective gloves/protective clothing/eye protection/ face protection. Avoid contact with eyes, skin, and clothing. Do not breathe mist or vapor. Use only with adequate ventilation. Wash hands thoroughly after handling.

Conditions for safe storage, including any incompatibilities : Keep away from food, drink and animal feeding stuffs. Keep container tightly closed in a dry, well-ventilated place. Ground container and transfer equipment to eliminate static electric sparks.

General information : Good general ventilation (typically 10 air changes per hour) should be used. Ventilation rates should be matched to conditions.
